We have duly registered the new business as a Co-operative Society for the Benefit of the Community (very much like the Rose and Crown).

A lot of hard work has been done to get to this point by Jerry Cleall-Harding and his team, but our work has only just begun.

This is an invitation to come to the Commemoration Hall on <u>Thursday 16 March at 7pm</u> to hear all about the project and how it will work.

We also need volunteers. So far over 60 people have shown an interest in helping in various ways, but now's the time to translate all this into a plan of action.

Would you be willing to be a member of one of the teams serving in the shop (even for just an hour or two each month), or would you be prepared to help behind the scenes?

We need people to order stock, carry out day to day administration, help to design a new layout for shop, market the new business and help fundraise.
