It is an offense to carry out, arrange or participate in irresponsible promotions likely to contribute to crime and disorder, prejudice to public order, public nuisance or harm children. Irresponsible promotions include games or other similar activities which require or encourage individuals to:

- 1. Drink quantities of alcohol within a time limit
- 2. Drink as much alcohol as possible
- 3. Provide free or discounted alcohol as a reward
- 4. Dispense alcohol by one person into the mouth of another
